

Field Walk and Photographs from 2023 Rawlinna Trip with Steve Ewings and Sarah Jeffery RNRM

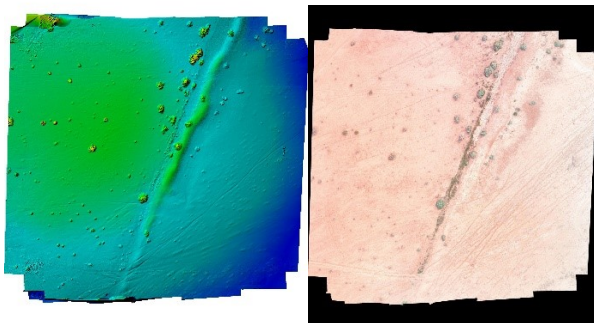
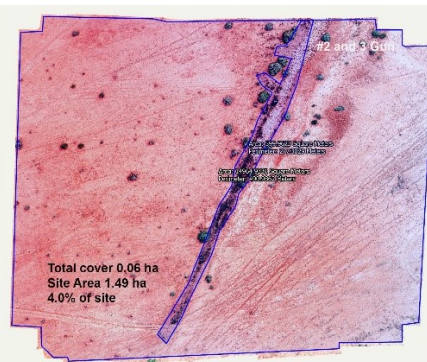
Amanda Day CEO GNRBA was instrumental in taking Steve Ewings and Sarah Jeffery out onto the Nullarbor to map areas of onion weed, train four pastoralists in drone mapping (who already have their own drones) and hold a BBQ Dinner at Rawlinna Grounds to explain the implications of onion weed infestation to a small group of Nullarbor pastoralists in 23-25 May 2023.

The travel, transportation, accommodation, and CEO time was supplied by GNRBA as was accommodation in Kalgoorlie. RNRM flew the two Rangelands NRM personnel to Kalgoorlie return as part of their commitment to the project.

Whilst on site Steve Ewing mapped sites on the Trans Line, at Rawlinna Station, Kanandah Station, Gunnadorah Station.

He trained Cameron Day Gunnadorah Station, Craig Chandler Rawlinna Station, Daniel Hogg Kinclaven Station (Daniels drone is only suitable for photos and co-ordinates not a mapping drone) and discussed training with Greg Campbell Kybo Station who has a drone and Neil White GNRBA LPMT.

The evening BBQ with food provided by GNRBA welcomed approx. 25 people from the 5 Nullarbor pastoral stations. There was a casual presentation by GNRBA and Steve Ewings re onion weed (GNRBA) and drone mapping (Steve Ewing).





April 2024 Nullarbor Muster 15 April 2023

Amanda Day CEO GNRBA took a display stand of cactus and onion weed, Bathurst burr detail out to the Nullarbor Muster at Rawlinna which attracted over 1500 people for the weekend. There was a stand set up with posters, information and samples of the weeds. Encouraging the general public to understand biosecurity, identify weeds, notify GNRBA of weeds co-ordinates and provided brochures/ flyers.

Progress 2024

GNRBA have since purchased a \$6,000 Mavic 3 drone and paid \$3,000 for Steve Ewing to train Neil White GNRBA LPMT in Drone mapping at Steves site in Perth.
